APPENDIX 1 – LETTER TO YOU MAYOR

Subject: Please step up for our kids!

Dear Mayor (Family name):

There are more than 534,000 children aged five and under living in Quebec right now. They are our greatest resource and our most cherished treasure. Our future is contingent on their being given a



happy and healthy upbringing. We can no longer turn a blind eye to the unstable and unfavourable environment too many of them are growing up in.

One in four kindergarten-age children (or as many as one in three in low-income communities) is vulnerable in at least one sphere of development. This can put them at a disadvantage at school and have repercussions throughout their whole life.

Early childhood development is an issue that matters a great deal to me, both personally and in my capacity as [an educator OR another role]. The experts on the Special Commission on the Rights of the Child and Youth Protection have themselves stressed the urgency of taking action to protect young children and improve their living conditions. We all have an essential role to play in building caring communities that look out for, and look after, our babies, toddlers and preschoolers and their families. And that is precisely the reason why I am reaching out to you today. Because you have the power to make a real difference.

A number of initiatives to improve these circumstances are already underway, and your backing would go a long way in building momentum. You can support individuals and community organizations working to help children five and under, advocate for family-friendly public policies and more, with the ultimate goal of driving home the importance of making this segment of the population a true social priority.

There are so many realistic, concrete solutions we can explore:

- Make more affordable housing options available to families
- Open up more safe public spaces for play and learning
- Provide activities specifically designed for families
- Implement efforts to improve access to high-quality educational childcare.

As a local government representative, and as a human being, you are undoubtedly sensitive to this plight. But you know as well as I do that it takes tangible, sustained and concerted action if we are to effect actual change in this regard. Together, we — me, you and your fellow elected officials, along with every community across the province — have the capacity and the responsibility to do something about this situation NOW. We need to put preventive measures into place that have a direct impact on the lives of our young children.

I urge you to join this province-wide movement and outpouring of support for our littlest citizens.
