- Provide information on how young children are faring in our society.
- Raise awareness at every level of society about the benefits and outcomes of taking collective action in the early years of a child's life.
- Engage people at every level of society and emphasize the importance of early intervention.
- Shine the spotlight on achievements by various stakeholders in nurturing the development of babies, toddlers and preschoolers.

- Knock down silos and better connect with vulnerable families throughout the early childhood periods, from conception to age five.
- Put winning conditions in place to implement public policies and programs conducive to early childhood development and family well-being.

Central Theme

Every child, no matter where in the province they were born or where they are growing up, should have an equal opportunity to thrive and succeed.

In a society as rich as ours, we cannot allow geographic and socioeconomic disparities to negatively impact the future of our youngest citizens.

What Kind of Solutions Can Be Put in Place?

Various measures can be taken to nurture children's development. These include:

- Support for expectant parents to give every baby the best possible start
- High-quality, accessible educational childcare
- Collective measures to create a better family-work balance
- Accessible, family-friendly healthcare and social services
- Safe, suitable and affordable housing to grow up in
- Safe public spaces for play and learning
- Support for organizations that work in a preventive capacity with families from before birth through early childhood.

In keeping with a proportionate universalism approach, services must be adjusted to suit the degree of need of young children in, and the socioeconomic characteristics of, a given area.

Call to Action

As **early childhood professionals and citizens**, we must continue to advocate for this cause.

Our networks must strive to make services for young children and parents accessible to families throughout the province.

Additionally, **our governments and institutions** must invest in a better future by prioritizing early childhood in their decision-making. To ensure equality of opportunities for our youngest children, our leaders must develop comprehensive public policies that will lead to the implementation of a full range of services for children and their families, from pregnancy onward.

Key Messages — General

- Early Childhood Week aims to give a voice to the **514,747 children** aged five and under in Quebec and make early childhood development a true priority for our society.
- By taking action as early as possible, beginning at pregnancy, we can give each baby an equal chance and create the conditions needed for every child to succeed.
- The following top the list of priorities aimed at making sure efforts to improve children's well-being are invested wisely:
 - Ensure an adequate standard of living: Provide access to affordable housing, healthy food in sufficient supply and a balance between family, work and studies, achieved through financial support proportionate to families' needs.
 - **Work together:** Break down silos by building bridges between the various stakeholders and aligning our advocacy efforts with those of policy-makers.
 - Take action as early as possible: Safeguard the health, well-being and development of all children, and ensure the best possible conditions and access to support are available to all parents, from pregnancy onward.
 - **Focus on services at the community level:** Support locally delivered services and existing community networks so that they can work in an upstream capacity and serve as a catalyst for prevention.


